Glossary of Terms, Abbreviations, and Acronyms

ABC – Approved Budget for the Contract.

ARCC – Allowable Range of Contract Cost.

BAC – Bids and Awards Committee.

Bid – A signed offer or proposal to undertake a contract submitted by a bidder in response to and in consonance with the requirements of the bidding documents. Also referred to as *Proposal* and *Tender*. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[c])

Bidder – Refers to a contractor, manufacturer, supplier, distributor and/or consultant who submits a bid in response to the requirements of the Bidding Documents. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[d])

Bidding Documents – The documents issued by the Procuring Entity as the bases for bids, furnishing all information necessary for a prospective bidder to prepare a bid for the Goods, Infrastructure Projects, and/or Consulting Services required by the Procuring Entity. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[e])

BIR – Bureau of Internal Revenue.

BSP – Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas.

CDA – Cooperative Development Authority.

Consulting Services – Refer to services for Infrastructure Projects and other types of projects or activities of the GOP requiring adequate external technical and professional expertise that are beyond the capability and/or capacity of the GOP to undertake such as, but not limited to: (i) advisory and review services; (ii) pre-investment or feasibility studies; (iii) design; (iv) construction supervision; (v) management and related services; and (vi) other technical services or special studies. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[i])

Contract – Refers to the agreement entered into between the Procuring Entity and the Supplier or Manufacturer or Distributor or Service Provider for procurement of Goods and Services; Contractor for Procurement of Infrastructure Projects; or Consultant or Consulting Firm for Procurement of Consulting Services; as the case may be, as recorded in the Contract Form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.

Contractor – is a natural or juridical entity whose proposal was accepted by the Procuring Entity and to whom the Contract to execute the Work was awarded. Contractor as used in these Bidding Documents may likewise refer to a supplier, distributor, manufacturer, or consultant.

CPI – Consumer Price Index.

DOLE – Department of Labor and Employment.

DTI – Department of Trade and Industry.

Foreign-funded Procurement or Foreign-Assisted Project – Refers to procurement whose funding source is from a foreign government, foreign or international financing institution as specified in the Treaty or International or Executive Agreement. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[b]).

GFI – Government Financial Institution.

GOCC – Government-owned and/or –controlled corporation.

Goods – Refer to all items, supplies, materials and general support services, except Consulting Services and Infrastructure Projects, which may be needed in the transaction of public businesses or in the pursuit of any government undertaking, project or activity, whether in the nature of equipment, furniture, stationery, materials for construction, or personal property of any kind, including non-personal or contractual services such as the repair and maintenance of equipment and furniture, as well as trucking, hauling, janitorial, security, and related or analogous services, as well as procurement of materials and supplies provided by the Procuring Entity for such services. The term “related” or “analogous services” shall include, but is not limited to, lease or purchase of office space, media advertisements, health maintenance services, and other services essential to the operation of the Procuring Entity. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[r])

GOP – Government of the Philippines.

Infrastructure Projects – Include the construction, improvement, rehabilitation, demolition, repair, restoration or maintenance of roads and bridges, railways, airports, seaports, communication facilities, civil works components of information technology projects, irrigation, flood control and drainage, water supply, sanitation, sewerage and solid waste management systems, shore protection, energy/power and electrification facilities, national buildings, school buildings, hospital buildings, and other related construction projects of the government. Also referred to as *civil works or works*. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[u])

LGUs – Local Government Units.

NFCC – Net Financial Contracting Capacity.

NGA – National Government Agency.

Procurement Project – refers to a specific or identified procurement covering goods, infrastructure project or consulting services. A Procurement Project shall be described, detailed, and scheduled in the Project Procurement Management Plan prepared by the agency which shall be consolidated in the procuring entity's Annual Procurement Plan. (GPPB Circular No. 06-2019 dated 17 July 2019)

Section I. Invitation to Bid

Rehabilitation/Improvement of Existing Portland Cement Concrete Pavement (PCCP) Road along Road B, Road I, Pavement at Container Yard Area, Police Station and Gate 3 Approach and Asphalt Overlay along East Avenue from H.S. Tech to Hitec RCD at the Cavite Economic Zone (CEZITB 2021-03-005)

1. The *PHILIPPINE ECONOMIC ZONE AUTHORITY-CAVITE ECONOMIC ZONE (PEZA-CEZ)*, through the *Corporate Operating Budget for CY 2021* intends to apply the sum of ***Pesos: Fourteen Million One Hundred Twenty Nine Thousand One Hundred Sixty and 86/100 Only (₱14,129,160.86)*** being the Approved Budget for the Contract (ABC) to payments under the contract for the ***Rehabilitation/Improvement of Existing Portland Cement Concrete Pavement (PCCP) Road along Road B, Road I, Pavement at Container Yard Area, Police Station and Gate 3 Approach and Asphalt Overlay along East Avenue from H.S. Tech to Hitec RCD at the Cavite Economic Zone (CEZITB 2021-03-005)***. Bids received in excess of the ABC shall be automatically rejected at bid opening.
2. The *PEZA-CEZ* now invites bids for the above Procurement Project. Completion of the Works is required within ***one hundred (100) calendar days***. Bidders should have completed, within ***the last five (5) years*** from the date of submission and receipt of bids, a contract similar to the Project. The description of an eligible bidder is contained in the Bidding Documents, particularly, in Section II (Instructions to Bidders).
3. Bidding will be conducted through open competitive bidding procedures using non-discretionary “*pass/fail*” criterion as specified in the 2016 revised Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of Republic Act (RA) No. 9184.

Bidding is restricted to Filipino citizens/sole proprietorships, cooperatives, and partnerships, or organizations with at least seventy five percent (75%) interest or outstanding capital stock belonging to citizens of the Philippines.
4. Interested bidders may obtain further information from ***CEZ-BAC Secretariat*** and inspect the Bidding Documents at the address given below from ***Monday to Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.***
5. A complete set of Bidding Documents may be acquired by interested bidders on ***23 March 2021*** from the given address and website/s below *and upon payment of the applicable fee for the Bidding Documents, pursuant to the latest Guidelines issued by the GPPB, in the amount of Twenty-five Thousand Pesos Only (₱25,000.00)*. The Procuring Entity shall allow the bidder to present its proof of payment for the fees *in person*.
6. The *PEZA-CEZ* will hold a Pre-Bid Conference on ***31 March 2021, 2:30pm*** at ***2nd Floor, Function Room, New Administration Building, Cavite Economic Zone,***

Rosario, Cavite, and/or through videoconferencing / webcasting via Microsoft Teams, which shall be open to prospective bidders. For bidders who wish not to be physically present during the pre-bid conference, the BAC Secretariat shall email invite/meeting ID and password to those who signify their intent via email below.

7. Bids must be duly received by the BAC Secretariat through (i) manual submission at the office address as indicated below, on or before **2:00pm, 12 April 2021**. Late bids shall not be accepted.
8. All bids must be accompanied by a bid security in any of the acceptable forms and in the amount stated in **ITB** Clause 16.
9. Bid opening shall be on **12 April 2021, 2:30pm** at the given address below. Bids will be opened in the presence of the bidders' representatives who choose to attend the activity.
10. In any case the above dates is declared a special non-working holiday, it will automatically be reset on the next working day.
11. The **PEZA-CEZ** reserves the right to reject any and all bids, declare a failure of bidding, or not award the contract at any time prior to contract award in accordance with Sections 35.6 and 41 of the 2016 revised Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of RA No. 9184, without thereby incurring any liability to the affected bidder or bidders.

Section II. Instructions to Bidders

1. Scope of Bid

The Procuring Entity, *PEZA-Cavite Economic Zone* invites Bids for the *Rehabilitation/Improvement of Existing Portland Cement Concrete Pavement (PCCP) Road along Road B, Road I, Pavement at Container Yard Area, Police Station and Gate 3 Approach and Asphalt Overlay along East Avenue from H.S. Tech to Hitec RCD at the Cavite Economic Zone*, with Project Identification Number *CEZITB 2021-03-005*.

The Procurement Project (referred to herein as “Project”) is for the construction of Works, as described in Section VI (Specifications).

2. Funding Information

2.1. The GOP through the source of funding as indicated below for *Corporate Operating Budget for CY 2021* in the amount of *Fourteen Million One Hundred Twenty-Nine Thousand One Hundred Sixty and 86/100 Only (₱14,129,160.86)*.

2.2. The source of funding is:

- a. GOCC, the Corporate Operating Budget.

3. Bidding Requirements

The Bidding for the Project shall be governed by all the provisions of RA No. 9184 and its 2016 revised IRR, including its Generic Procurement Manual and associated policies, rules and regulations as the primary source thereof, while the herein clauses shall serve as the secondary source thereof.

Any amendments made to the IRR and other GPPB issuances shall be applicable only to the ongoing posting, advertisement, or invitation to bid by the BAC through the issuance of a supplemental or bid bulletin.

The Bidder, by the act of submitting its Bid, shall be deemed to have inspected the site, determined the general characteristics of the contracted Works and the conditions for this Project, such as the location and the nature of the work; (b) climatic conditions; (c) transportation facilities; (c) nature and condition of the terrain, geological conditions at the site communication facilities, requirements, location and availability of construction aggregates and other materials, labor, water, electric power and access roads; and (d) other factors that may affect the cost, duration and execution or implementation of the contract, project, or work and examine all instructions, forms, terms, and project requirements in the Bidding Documents.

4. Corrupt, Fraudulent, Collusive, Coercive, and Obstructive Practices

The Procuring Entity, as well as the Bidders and Contractors, shall observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of the contract. They or through an agent shall not engage in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, and

obstructive practices defined under Annex “I” of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 or other integrity violations in competing for the Project.

5. Eligible Bidders

5.1. Only Bids of Bidders found to be legally, technically, and financially capable will be evaluated.

5.2. The Bidder must have an experience of having completed a Single Largest Completed Contract (SLCC) that is similar to this Project, equivalent to at least fifty percent (50%) of the ABC adjusted, if necessary, by the Bidder to current prices using the PSA’s CPI, except under conditions provided for in Section 23.4.2.4 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

A contract is considered to be “similar” to the contract to be bid if it has the major categories of work stated in the **BDS**.

5.3. For Foreign-funded Procurement, the Procuring Entity and the foreign government/foreign or international financing institution may agree on another track record requirement, as specified in the Bidding Document prepared for this purpose.

5.4. The Bidders shall comply with the eligibility criteria under Section 23.4.2 of the 2016 IRR of RA No. 9184.

6. Origin of Associated Goods

There is no restriction on the origin of Goods other than those prohibited by a decision of the UN Security Council taken under Chapter VII of the Charter of the UN.

7. Subcontracts

7.1. The Bidder may subcontract portions of the Project to the extent allowed by the Procuring Entity as stated herein, but in no case more than fifty percent (50%) of the Project.

a. Subcontracting is not allowed.

8. Pre-Bid Conference

The Procuring Entity will hold a pre-bid conference for this Project on **31 March 2021, 2:30pm** and either at its physical address **at 2F Function Room, New Admin Building, CEZ Rosario Cavite** and/or through videoconferencing/webcasting} as indicated in paragraph 6 of the **IB**.

9. Clarification and Amendment of Bidding Documents

Prospective bidders may request for clarification on and/or interpretation of any part of the Bidding Documents. Such requests must be in writing and received by the Procuring Entity, either at its given address or through electronic mail indicated in the

IB, at least ten (10) calendar days before the deadline set for the submission and receipt of Bids.

10. Documents Comprising the Bid: Eligibility and Technical Components

- 10.1. The first envelope shall contain the eligibility and technical documents of the Bid as specified in **Section IX. Checklist of Technical and Financial Documents**.
- 10.2. If the eligibility requirements or statements, the bids, and all other documents for submission to the BAC are in foreign language other than English, it must be accompanied by a translation in English, which shall be authenticated by the appropriate Philippine foreign service establishment, post, or the equivalent office having jurisdiction over the foreign bidder's affairs in the Philippines. For Contracting Parties to the Apostille Convention, only the translated documents shall be authenticated through an apostille pursuant to GPPB Resolution No. 13-2019 dated 23 May 2019. The English translation shall govern, for purposes of interpretation of the bid.
- 10.3. A valid PCAB License is required, and in case of joint ventures, a valid special PCAB License, and registration for the type and cost of the contract for this Project. Any additional type of Contractor license or permit shall be indicated in the **BDS**.
- 10.4. A List of Contractor's key personnel (e.g., Project Manager, Project Engineers, Materials Engineers, and Foremen) assigned to the contract to be bid, with their complete qualification and experience data shall be provided. These key personnel must meet the required minimum years of experience set in the **BDS**.
- 10.5. A List of Contractor's major equipment units, which are owned, leased, and/or under purchase agreements, supported by proof of ownership, certification of availability of equipment from the equipment lessor/vendor for the duration of the project, as the case may be, must meet the minimum requirements for the contract set in the **BDS**.

11. Documents Comprising the Bid: Financial Component

- 11.1. The second bid envelope shall contain the financial documents for the Bid as specified in **Section IX. Checklist of Technical and Financial Documents**.
- 11.2. Any bid exceeding the ABC indicated in paragraph 1 of the **IB** shall not be accepted.
- 11.3. For Foreign-funded procurement, a ceiling may be applied to bid prices provided the conditions are met under Section 31.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

12. Alternative Bids

Bidders shall submit offers that comply with the requirements of the Bidding Documents, including the basic technical design as indicated in the drawings and specifications. Unless there is a value engineering clause in the **BDS**, alternative Bids shall not be accepted.

13. Bid Prices

All bid prices for the given scope of work in the Project as awarded shall be considered as fixed prices, and therefore not subject to price escalation during contract implementation, except under extraordinary circumstances as determined by the NEDA and approved by the GPPB pursuant to the revised Guidelines for Contract Price Escalation guidelines.

14. Bid and Payment Currencies

14.1. Bid prices may be quoted in the local currency or tradeable currency accepted by the BSP at the discretion of the Bidder. However, for purposes of bid evaluation, Bids denominated in foreign currencies shall be converted to Philippine currency based on the exchange rate as published in the BSP reference rate bulletin on the day of the bid opening.

14.2. *Payment of the contract price shall be made in:*

- a. Philippine Pesos.

15. Bid Security

15.1. The Bidder shall submit a Bid Securing Declaration or any form of Bid Security in the amount indicated in the **BDS**, which shall be not less than the percentage of the ABC in accordance with the schedule in the **BDS**.

15.2. The Bid and bid security shall be valid until **One Hundred Twenty (120) calendar days from the date of opening of bids**. Any bid not accompanied by an acceptable bid security shall be rejected by the Procuring Entity as non-responsive.

16. Sealing and Marking of Bids

Each Bidder shall submit two (2) copies of the first and second components of its Bid. (Original and Copy 1)

The Procuring Entity may request additional hard copies and/or electronic copies of the Bid. However, failure of the Bidders to comply with the said request shall not be a ground for disqualification.

If the Procuring Entity allows the submission of bids through online submission to the given website or any other electronic means, the Bidder shall submit an electronic copy of its Bid, which must be digitally signed. An electronic copy that cannot be opened or is corrupted shall be considered non-responsive and, thus, automatically disqualified.

17. **Deadline for Submission of Bids**

The Bidders shall submit on the specified date and time and either at its physical address or through online submission as indicated in paragraph 7 of the **IB**.

2:00pm, 12 April 2021 through manual submission

18. **Opening and Preliminary Examination of Bids**

18.1. The BAC shall open the Bids in public at the time, on the date, and at the place specified in paragraph 9 of the **IB**. The Bidders' representatives who are present shall sign a register evidencing their attendance. In case videoconferencing, webcasting or other similar technologies will be used, attendance of participants shall likewise be recorded by the BAC Secretariat.

In case the Bids cannot be opened as scheduled due to justifiable reasons, the rescheduling requirements under Section 29 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 shall prevail.

18.2. The preliminary examination of Bids shall be governed by Section 30 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

19. **Detailed Evaluation and Comparison of Bids**

19.1. The Procuring Entity's BAC shall immediately conduct a detailed evaluation of all Bids rated "*passed*" using non-discretionary pass/fail criteria. The BAC shall consider the conditions in the evaluation of Bids under Section 32.2 of 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

19.2. If the Project allows partial bids, all Bids and combinations of Bids as indicated in the **BDS** shall be received by the same deadline and opened and evaluated simultaneously so as to determine the Bid or combination of Bids offering the lowest calculated cost to the Procuring Entity. Bid Security as required by **ITB** Clause 16 shall be submitted for each contract (lot) separately.

19.3. In all cases, the NFCC computation pursuant to Section 23.4.2.6 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 must be sufficient for the total of the ABCs for all the lots participated in by the prospective Bidder.

20. **Post Qualification**

Within a non-extendible period of five (5) calendar days from receipt by the Bidder of the notice from the BAC that it submitted the Lowest Calculated Bid, the Bidder shall submit its latest income and business tax returns filed and paid through the BIR Electronic Filing and Payment System (eFPS), and other appropriate licenses and permits required by law and stated in the **BDS**.

21. Signing of the Contract

The documents required in Section 37.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 shall form part of the Contract. Additional Contract documents are indicated in the **BDS**.

Section IV. General Conditions of Contract

1. **Scope of Contract**

This Contract shall include all such items, although not specifically mentioned, that can be reasonably inferred as being required for its completion as if such items were expressly mentioned herein. All the provisions of RA No. 9184 and its 2016 revised IRR, including the Generic Procurement Manual, and associated issuances, constitute the primary source for the terms and conditions of the Contract, and thus, applicable in contract implementation. Herein clauses shall serve as the secondary source for the terms and conditions of the Contract.

This is without prejudice to Sections 74.1 and 74.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 allowing the GPPB to amend the IRR, which shall be applied to all procurement activities, the advertisement, posting, or invitation of which were issued after the effectivity of the said amendment.

2. **Sectional Completion of Works**

If sectional completion is specified in the **Special Conditions of Contract (SCC)**, references in the Conditions of Contract to the Works, the Completion Date, and the Intended Completion Date shall apply to any Section of the Works (other than references to the Completion Date and Intended Completion Date for the whole of the Works).

3. **Possession of Site**

4.1. The Procuring Entity shall give possession of all or parts of the Site to the Contractor based on the schedule of delivery indicated in the **SCC**, which corresponds to the execution of the Works. If the Contractor suffers delay or incurs cost from failure on the part of the Procuring Entity to give possession in accordance with the terms of this clause, the Procuring Entity's Representative shall give the Contractor a Contract Time Extension and certify such sum as fair to cover the cost incurred, which sum shall be paid by Procuring Entity.

4.2. If possession of a portion is not given by the above date, the Procuring Entity will be deemed to have delayed the start of the relevant activities. The resulting adjustments in contract time to address such delay may be addressed through contract extension provided under Annex "E" of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

4. **The Contractor's Obligations**

The Contractor shall employ the key personnel named in the Schedule of Key Personnel indicating their designation, in accordance with **ITB** Clause 10.3 and specified in the **BDS**, to carry out the supervision of the Works.

The Procuring Entity will approve any proposed replacement of key personnel only if their relevant qualifications and abilities are equal to or better than those of the personnel listed in the Schedule.

5. Performance Security

- 5.1. Within ten (10) calendar days from receipt of the Notice of Award from the Procuring Entity but in no case later than the signing of the contract by both parties, the successful Bidder shall furnish the performance security in any of the forms prescribed in Section 39 of the 2016 revised IRR.
- 5.2. The Contractor, by entering into the Contract with the Procuring Entity, acknowledges the right of the Procuring Entity to institute action pursuant to RA No. 3688 against any subcontractor be they an individual, firm, partnership, corporation, or association supplying the Contractor with labor, materials and/or equipment for the performance of this Contract.

6. Site Investigation Reports

The Contractor, in preparing the Bid, shall rely on any Site Investigation Reports referred to in the SCC supplemented by any information obtained by the Contractor.

7. Warranty

- 7.1. In case the Contractor fails to undertake the repair works under Section 62.2.2 of the 2016 revised IRR, the Procuring Entity shall forfeit its performance security, subject its property(ies) to attachment or garnishment proceedings, and perpetually disqualify it from participating in any public bidding. All payables of the GOP in his favor shall be offset to recover the costs.
- 7.2. The warranty against Structural Defects/Failures, except that occasioned-on force majeure, shall cover the period from the date of issuance of the Certificate of Final Acceptance by the Procuring Entity. Specific duration of the warranty is found in the SCC.

8. Liability of the Contractor

Subject to additional provisions, if any, set forth in the SCC, the Contractor's liability under this Contract shall be as provided by the laws of the Republic of the Philippines.

If the Contractor is a joint venture, all partners to the joint venture shall be jointly and severally liable to the Procuring Entity.

9. Termination for Other Causes

Contract termination shall be initiated in case it is determined *prima facie* by the Procuring Entity that the Contractor has engaged, before, or during the implementation of the contract, in unlawful deeds and behaviors relative to contract acquisition and implementation, such as, but not limited to corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, and obstructive practices as stated in **ITB** Clause 4.

10. Dayworks

Subject to the guidelines on Variation Order in Annex “E” of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184, and if applicable as indicated in the **SCC**, the Dayworks rates in the Contractor’s Bid shall be used for small additional amounts of work only when the Procuring Entity’s Representative has given written instructions in advance for additional work to be paid for in that way.

11. Program of Work

11.1. The Contractor shall submit to the Procuring Entity’s Representative for approval the said Program of Work showing the general methods, arrangements, order, and timing for all the activities in the Works. The submissions of the Program of Work are indicated in the **SCC**.

11.2. The Contractor shall submit to the Procuring Entity’s Representative for approval an updated Program of Work at intervals no longer than the period stated in the **SCC**. If the Contractor does not submit an updated Program of Work within this period, the Procuring Entity’s Representative may withhold the amount stated in the **SCC** from the next payment certificate and continue to withhold this amount until the next payment after the date on which the overdue Program of Work has been submitted.

12. Instructions, Inspections and Audits

The Contractor shall permit the GOP or the Procuring Entity to inspect the Contractor’s accounts and records relating to the performance of the Contractor and to have them audited by auditors of the GOP or the Procuring Entity, as may be required.

13. Advance Payment

The Procuring Entity shall, upon a written request of the Contractor which shall be submitted as a Contract document, make an advance payment to the Contractor in an amount not exceeding fifteen percent (15%) of the total contract price, to be made in lump sum, or at the most two installments according to a schedule specified in the **SCC**, subject to the requirements in Annex “E” of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

14. Progress Payments

The Contractor may submit a request for payment for Work accomplished. Such requests for payment shall be verified and certified by the Procuring Entity’s Representative/Project Engineer. Except as otherwise stipulated in the **SCC**, materials and equipment delivered on the site but not completely put in place shall not be included for payment.

15. Operating and Maintenance Manuals

15.1. If required, the Contractor will provide “as built” Drawings and/or operating and maintenance manuals as specified in the **SCC**.

- 15.2. If the Contractor does not provide the Drawings and/or manuals by the dates stated above, or they do not receive the Procuring Entity's Representative's approval, the Procuring Entity's Representative may withhold the amount stated in the **SCC** from payments due to the Contractor.

A. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

1. SCOPE

Furnish all materials, labor, equipment, testing and all other facilities for the satisfactory performance of all work necessary for the completion of the project. This project includes concrete re-blocking which comprise of the following; concrete cutting, removal and hauling of excess excavated materials, sub-grade preparation (levelling and compaction of existing sub-grade), base course application (spreading and compaction), concreting and asphalt overlay on existing asphalt road on the following location:

Road B, A=1,812.0 m²
 Road I, A=219.375 m²
 Container Yard, A₁=261.90 m²
 Container Yard, A₂ =181.86 m²
 Near Gate 3, A=42.50 m²
 Near Police Station, A=569.08 m²
 East Avenue (Asphalt Overlay), A=4,078.1m²
 (L=313.7 m, W=13.0m)

2. MOBILIZATION / DEMOBILIZATION

Mobilization shall include transportation to the site of contractor's plant, materials, equipment, employees and furnishings and temporary facilities. Demobilization shall include dismantlement and removal from the site of contractor's plant, materials and equipment and all temporary facilities. Demobilization includes clean-up of the site after completion of the contract work.

3. TEMPORARY FACILITIES

The Contractor shall provide a temporary shelter but shall not be permitted to erect temporary buildings or structures inside the zone.

4. PROJECT BILLBOARD

- The contractor shall install one (1) billboard in projects site measuring 1200mmx2400mm. Project billboard shall be installed for government information projects to inform the public of the implementation of the project and to advise the road users of the on-going construction.
- The contractor shall also install one (1) billboard as per COA circular no. 2013-004.

5. WARNING SIGNAGES

The Contractor shall furnish and install and maintain at all times during the duration of the contract the necessary warning signs (0.80mx1.0m tarpaulin on wooden frame with reflectorized sticker border), caution tape, barricades (bamboo pole with concrete base with 3 layers reflectorized sticker) for guidance of traffic thru the work zone.

6. CONSTRUCTION SAFETY AND HEALTH

- The contractor shall submit appropriate Construction Safety and Health Program (CSHP) in accordance with DOLE D.O. no. 13, series of 1998. The proposed CSHP shall be approved by DOLE-BWC and shall submit a copy to the Authority.
- The contractor shall provide appropriate personal protective equipment shall not less than quantity indicated in POW (Program of Works). For General Construction Work, the required PPE for all workers shall be safety helmet, safety gloves and safety shoes.
- Also, provide safety and warning signages around the construction site.

B. EARTHWORKS

1. REMOVAL OF EXISTING STRUCTURES/PCCP

Removal of existing structures such as PCCP and other obstruction shall be carefully done with appropriate equipment. Excess excavated materials and concrete debris shall be disposed-off properly outside the zone premises. (Note: dumping site for excavated debris shall be determined by the Contractor).

In the case where the Engineer instructed the Contractor to cut or remove existing facilities, or parts thereof, such as sewers, drains, water service or other utility lines, the Contractor shall provide and maintain satisfactory bypass service and/or protection during the construction period. When only a portion of an existing structure is to be removed, care shall be taken not to damage the retained portion. During removal, the Contractor shall ensure the safety of his work and the general public.

2. SUB-GRADE PREPARATION

This item shall consist of the preparation/improvement of the existing subgrade (which may disturb during the removal of existing PCCP) for the support of overlaying structural layers. It shall extend to full width of the roadway or portion of the road to be repair. Any work on the preparation of the subgrade shall not be started unless prior work herein described shall have been approved by the Engineer.

The full width shall be conditioned by removing any soft or other unstable material that will not compacted properly. The entire roadbed shall be shaped and compacted to the requirements of Subsection 104.3.3 (compaction) of DPWH standard.

3. BASE COURSE

- a. **Materials** - It shall consist of hard, durable particles of fragments of stone or gravel crushed to the size and of the quantity requirements of this item. It shall be free from vegetable matters, lumps or balls of clay and other deleterious substances, The material shall be of such nature that it can compacted readily to form a firm, stable base. The base material shall conform to the grading requirements of Table 202.1 Grading Requirements of DPWH Standard 2004.
- b. **Spreading and Compacting** - The crushed aggregate material shall be placed at a uniform mixture on prepared sub-base in a quantity which will provide the required compacted thickness. Maximum compaction thickness shall not exceed 150mm all subsequent layers shall be spread and compacted in a similar manner. The moisture content of the material shall, if necessary be adjusted prior to compaction by watering with approved sprinklers mounted on trucks or by drying out as required in order to obtain the required compaction.

Compaction of each layer shall continue until a field density of at least 95 percent of the maximum dry density determined in accordance with AASHTO T 180, Method D has been achieved. In-place density determination shall be made in accordance with AASTHO 191.

C. PORTLAND CEMENT CONCRTE PAVEMENT

1. **Ready-Mixed Concrete (RMC)** – Used ready mixed concrete 3000 psi at 28 days for PCCP and 3000 psi at 7 days for pavement near gate 3, PCCP going to gate 3 along Container yard, PCCP going/fronting to driveway along Road B and Road I and 2500psi at 28 days for pavement near Police Station in accordance to ASTM standards. No concrete pouring shall allow without the approval of PEZA Engineer.
2. **Slump Test and Compressive Test** - All concrete works shall be subjected to slump test and compressive strength test. The Contractor shall provide the following apparatus and sampling procedures:
 - a) Slumped cone made of galvanized metal not thinner than Ga. 16, in the form of a frustum of a cone with base of 200 mm (8") diameter and top of 100 mm (4") diameter and a height of 300 mm (12").
 - b) Tamping rod mad of a round, straight steel rod 16mm (5/8") in diameter and approximately 600 mm (24) inches in length. One end of which (tamping end) shall be rounded to a hemispherical tip of 16 mm (5/8") diameter.
 - c) Measuring tape
 - d) Scoop of shovel
 - e) Slumps shall be within 50 mm (2") to 75 mm (3").

- f) Sampling and Testing - Testing of fresh concrete (slump test) and compressive test shall be done by the contractor with the supervision of PEZA Engineers. Compressive test shall be conducted by a DPWH testing laboratory and shall submit test results thereof to the Authority. For Structural Concrete, slump should have 2 tests for every batch mix while compressive strength test on concrete cylinder samples, 1 (one) set consisting 3 (three) concrete cylinder samples shall be taken from each day's pouring and to represent not more than 75 cu.m. of concrete or fraction thereof.
3. **Reinforcing Steel** – Shall conform to the requirements of ASTM standards for grade 40. Ensure that reinforcement are clean, of the correct dimensions, and properly placed in accordance with approved reinforcement drawing. After it has been installed, reinforcement shall be checked for compliance as to size, shape, length, splicing, position, number and required supports. Also, it should be painted by red oxide.
4. **Formworks** – Forms shall be of steel, of an approved section, and of depth equal to the thickness of the pavement edge. The base of the forms shall be sufficient width to provide necessary stability in all directions. The flange braces must extend outward on the base to not less than 2/3 the height of the form. All forms shall be rigidly supported on bed of thoroughly compacted material during the entire operation of placing and finishing of concrete. Forms shall be provided with adequate devices for secure setting so that when in place, they will withstand, without visible spring or settlement, the impact and vibration of the consolidation and finishing or paving equipment.
5. **Paving and Finishing Equipment** - The concrete shall be placed with an approved paver designed to spread, consolidate, screed and float finish the freshly placed concrete in one complete pass of the machine in such a manner that a minimum of hand finishing will be necessary to provide a dense and homogeneous pavement on conformance with the Plans and Specifications. The finishing machine shall be equipped with at least two (2) oscillating type transverse screed.

Vibrators shall operate at a frequency of 8,300 to 9,600 impulses per minute under load at a maximum spacing of 60 cm.

6. **Concrete Saw** - The Contractor shall provide sawing equipment in adequate number of units and power to compete the sawing with the water-cooled diamond edge saw blade or an abrasive wheel to the required dimensions and at the required rate. He shall provide at least one (1) stand-by saw in good working condition and with an ample supply of saw blades.
7. **Joint Fillers** - Poured joint fillers shall be mixed asphalt and mineral conforming to the applicable to the requirements of Item 705, Joint Materials.

- 8. **Grout / Epoxy** – used to fill the hole by dowels connecting the existing and the new pavement. The contractor shall provide drilling equipment with gen. set to complete the installation of grout/epoxy on the connection of existing and new pavement.

D. ASPHALT OVERLAY

1. PREPARATION OF BASE COURSE

Before placing the bituminous coat, underlying course shall be cleaned of loose stones, dirt and other deleterious materials using power blower. When the underlying course is wet due to rain or other causes, that bituminous coat shall not be placed until it is dry and the Engineer has approved the work execution.

2. Spreading and Compaction

- The hot asphalt cement mixture shall be spread by means of a paving machine. Bituminous paver shall be self-contained, power-propelled unit with an activated screed or strike-off assembly, heated if necessary, and shall be capable of spreading and finishing courses of bituminous plant mix material which meet the specified thickness, smoothness and grade.
- The asphalt finisher shall operate in such manner to spread the hot asphalt cement mixture to the full width along the forms set properly meeting the designated lines and uniform layer.
- If manual spreading is unavoidable, the mixture shall be spread carefully and thoroughly so that no segregation of the asphalt cement mixture occurs.
- The temperature of the hot cement mixture spread and shall not be lower than 120 degrees celsius as standard range, with tamden roller or triple axis roller to finish to a flat and smooth surface, eliminating the roller marks left from secondary rolling or small corrugations on the surface.
- In the area not accessible to the roller, the hot asphalt cement mixture shall be thoroughly compacted with plate compactor or any other suitable tools approved by the Engineer.
- The spreading operation shall immediately be suspended when it starts raining during the operation.

E. DURATION OF PROJECT

Completion of projects shall be 100 calendar days from receipt of Notice to Proceed.
